Analytical Report

Initially, the contents of one box of baking soda and one RDFresh “REACH-IN” bag were weighed to determine the baseline. At 30 days, a contents only weight measurement of each container in refrigerator #1 was recorded.

CONCLUSION:

- Given no weight gain by the baking soda, it is highly unlikely that it could effectively be absorbing refrigeration odor.
- Given the weight gain of the RDFRESH “REACH-IN” bag, it is highly likely that it could effectively be absorbing refrigeration odor.
